

Public Notice: State of Alaska / DEC - General Permit 3 for Major Source Asphalt Plants

Deadline: March 11, 2022

The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) proposes to renew the Air Quality Control General Permit 3 (GP3) for asphalt plants, under Alaska Statutes 46.14 and regulation 18 AAC 50.

Pending Applications: Granite Construction Company's CPP Stan Steel Hot Asphalt Plant & Pioneer Batch Asphalt Plant, Colaska Inc. dba QAP's HP#9 CMI 500 Plant, and JJC Enterprises, Inc.'s 9 Mile JJC Pit Plant

Location: Statewide. Current locations of existing GP3 Sources: Dillingham, Wasilla, Palmer, and Anchorage.

ADEC Preliminary Review: Based on review of the application, ADEC drafted a preliminary renewal general permit for major source asphalt plants under AS 46.14 and 18 AAC 50.

<u>Available Information:</u> Copies of the permit application, <u>ADEC's draft operating permit</u>, and <u>draft statement of basis</u> (SOB) and the GP3 Public Notice.

Deepfake Technology and its Implications for the Future of Cyber Attacks

Recently I received a call on my personal cellphone. The call started out as many do; with a slight pause after I answered. Initially I assumed this pause was caused by whatever auto-dialer software the spammer was using to initiate the call before their text-to-speech software starts talking about my car's extended warranty. Once the pause was over, however, I was surprised by a very human voice. She initiated the conversation by giving her name and a simple greeting, which was closely followed by the pitch she was trained to give.

It was during my response to her greeting (a "How are you doing" type question) that I noticed the issue. Another slight pause. As soon as I started speaking, the noise on the other side of the phone went dead, as if a recording had been switched off. This was my first sign that I wasn't dealing with your run-of-the-mill telemarketer. Once the recording (for this is what it turned out to be) began with the next line in the pre-programmed speech, with no acknowledgement of my response, I knew I was dealing with a robot powered by technology that simulated a real voice.

This is just one of many examples of "Deepfake" technology. Scheduling in Oracle Primavera P6 for U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Projects

Virtual Course Date: March 30-31, 2022.

Most capital construction projects for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) require a schedule in Primavera format. This schedule is the baseline from which all progress is measured, provides the foundation for Pay Applications, and is the integration point with USACE's Resident Management System (RMS 3.0).
